1.8	(a) \$ in fiscal year 2017 is appropriated from the general fund to the Board
1.9	of Regents of the University of Minnesota to expand and strengthen the oversight,
1.10	compliance, and training functions of the university's institutional review board. The
1.11	appropriation must be used to:
1.12	(1) further develop and clarify existing university policies and procedures related
1.13	to the lawful and ethical treatment of human subjects and human tissue in research
1.14	activities, including enhancement of applicable penalties for violation of these policies
1.15	and procedures;
1.16	(2) institute a system of frequent, random, unannounced inspections and audits of
1.17	research activities involving human tissue to verify compliance with applicable federal
1.18	and state laws, university policies and procedures, and other professional standards related
1.19	to purchasing, handling, and disposing of human tissue;
1.20	(3) conduct education and outreach programs, including instituting a required
1.21	comprehensive training program, on applicable federal and state laws, university policies
1.22	and procedures, and other professional standards related to the respectful, humane, and
1.23	ethical treatment of human subjects and human tissue in research, for all students and

employees engaged in these activities; and

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(4) establish an anonymous reporting system to receive complaints of activities that
may violate applicable federal and state laws, university policies and procedures, and
other professional standards in research involving human subjects and human tissue by
the university, university students or employees, or any other person engaged in research
activities in university facilities.
(b) As used in this section, "human tissue" includes, but is not limited to, fetal

tissue and embryonic stem cells or tissue.
