1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 16E.0465, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.8	to read:
1.9	Subd. 4. Projects of more than \$1,000,000 must be subject to contract. An agency
1.10	must enter a contract with one or more vendors for the development and completion of an
1.11	information and telecommunications technology project with a total expected cost of more
1.12	than \$1,000,000. The contract must be solicited, awarded, and executed according to the
1.13	requirements of chapter 16C. Notwithstanding section 16C.08, subdivision 2, a competitive
1.14	proposal process must be used for professional and technical services related to a project
1.15	subject to this subdivision, regardless of whether a current state agency employee is able
1.16	and available to perform the services called for by the contract. The state chief information
1.17	officer may submit a proposal in response to a solicitation required by this subdivision.

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(1) each project presented to the office for consultation in the time since the last report; 2.1 (2) the information technology cost associated with the project, including the information 2.2 technology cost as a percentage of the project's complete budget; 2.3 (3) whether a solicitation was required under section 16E.0465, subdivision 4, and, if 2.4 so, the status of the solicitation; 2.5 (4) the status of the information technology components of the project's development; 2.6 (4) (5) the date the information technology components of the project are expected to 2.7 be completed; and 2.8 (5) (6) the projected costs for ongoing support and maintenance of the information 2.9 technology components after the project is complete. 2.10 2.11

## Sec. 3. **EFFECTIVE DATE.**

This act is effective July 1, 2022, and applies to information and telecommunications 2.12 projects for which an appropriation is provided on or after that date. 2.13
