2.5	the legislative committees and divisions with jurisdiction over agriculture regarding the

- Subd. 4. Loans. (a) The authority may disburse loans through an intermediary to farmers who are eligible under subdivision 3. The total accumulative loan principal must not exceed 2.10 \$10,000 \$20,000 per loan. 2.11
- (b) Refinancing an existing debt is not an eligible purpose. 2.12
- 2.13 (c) The loan may be disbursed over a period not to exceed six years.

Subd. 2. Expiration. This section expires August 1, 2025.

- (d) A borrower may receive loans, depending on the availability of funds, up to 70 2.14 percent of the estimated value of the crop or livestock. 2.15
- (e) Security for the loan must be a personal note executed by the borrower and any other 2.16 security required by the intermediary or the authority. 2.17
  - (f) The authority may prescribe forms and establish an application process for applicants to apply for a loan.
- (g) The interest payable on loans for the pilot agricultural microloan program must be 2.20 at a rate determined by the authority. 2.21
- (h) Loans under this program will be made using money in the revolving loan account 2.22 established under section 41B.06. 2.23
- (i) Repayments of financial assistance under this section, including principal and interest, 2.24 must be deposited into the revolving loan account established under section 41B.06. 2.25
