Minnesota Statutes 2017 Supplement, section 120B.12, subdivision 2, is amended 1.5 to read: 1.6 Subd. 2. **Identification**; report. (a) Each school district shall must identify before the 1.7 end of kindergarten, grade 1, and grade 2 students who are not reading at grade level before 1.8 the end of the current school year and shall must identify students in grade 3 or higher who 1.9 demonstrate a reading difficulty to a classroom teacher. A school district must screen for 1.10 dyslexia (1) all students beginning in kindergarten and no later than the beginning of grade 1 11 2, and (2) any student in grade 2 or higher who is identified as not reading at grade level. 1 12 (b) Reading assessments in English, and in the predominant languages of district students 1.13 where practicable, must identify and evaluate students' areas of academic need related to 1.14 literacy. The district also must monitor the progress and provide reading instruction 1.15 appropriate to the specific needs of English learners. The district must use a locally adopted, 1.16 developmentally appropriate, and culturally responsive assessment and annually report 1.17 summary assessment results to the commissioner by July 1. 1.18 (c) The district also must annually report to the commissioner by July 1 a summary of 1.19 the district's efforts to screen and identify students with: 1.20 (1) dyslexia, using screening tools such as those recommended by the department's 1.21

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dyslexia and literacy specialist; or
