1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2017 Supplement, section 197.791, subdivision 3, is amended
1.8	to read:
1.9	Subd. 3. Duties; responsibilities. (a) The commissioner shall establish policies and
1.10	procedures including, but not limited to, procedures for student application record keeping,
1.11	information sharing, payment of educational assistance benefits under subdivision 5, payment
1.12	of apprenticeship or on-the-job training benefits under subdivision 5a, payment of other
1.13	educational or professional benefits under subdivision $\frac{5}{5b}$, and other procedures the
1.14	commissioner considers appropriate and necessary for effective and efficient administration
1.15	of the program established in this section.
1.16	(b) The commissioner may delegate part or all of the administrative procedures for the
1.17	program to responsible representatives of participating eligible institutions. The commissioner
1.18	may execute an interagency agreement with the Minnesota Office of Higher Education for

2.7	(2) the state grant program under section 136A.121; and
2.8	(3) any federal military or veterans educational benefits including but not limited to the

2.11	a veteran, except veterans disability payments from the United States Veterans Administration

aggregate benefits under this subdivision and subdivision 5 must not exceed \$10,000 in the
 eligible person's lifetime.

3.4 (f) If an eligible person receives benefits under subdivision 5a, the eligible person's
3.5 aggregate benefits under this subdivision and subdivision 5a must not exceed \$10,000 in
3.6 the eligible person's lifetime.

3.7 (d) For a part-time student, the amount of educational assistance must not exceed \$500 3.8 per semester or term of enrollment. For the purpose of this paragraph, a part-time 3.9 undergraduate student is a student taking fewer than 12 credits or the equivalent for a 3.10 semester or term of enrollment and a part-time graduate student is a student considered part 3.11 time by the eligible institution the graduate student is attending. The minimum award for 3.12 undergraduate and graduate students is \$50 per term.
