1.9	Subd. 26. Administration of medical assistance and MinnesotaCare. (a) The
1.10	commissioner shall contract with a third-party administrator to administer the medical
1.11	assistance and MinnesotaCare programs beginning January 1, 2025. The contract must
1.12	require the administrator to:
1.13	(1) provide benefits management, claims processing, and enrollee support services;
1.14	(2) coordinate its activities with the eligibility determination functions performed by
1.15	MNsure and county agencies; and
1.16	(3) increase provider payment rates or implement innovative methods in health care
1.17	delivery and reimbursement in order to ensure access to care and improve health care quality.
