1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 148F.025, subdivision 4, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 4. Background investigation. The applicant must sign a release authorizing the
1.8	board to obtain information from the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension, the Department of
1.9	Human Services, the Office of Health Facilities Complaints, and other agencies specified
1.10	by the board. After the board has given written notice to an individual who is the subject
1.11	of a background investigation, the agencies shall assist the board with the investigation by
1.12	giving the board criminal conviction data, reports about substantiated maltreatment of minors
1.13	and vulnerable adults, and other information. The board may contract with the commissioner
1.14	of human services to obtain criminal history data from the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension.
1.15	Information obtained under this subdivision is private data on individuals as defined in
1.16	section 13.02, subdivision 12. The board shall not automatically disqualify an applicant
1.17	who is a nonviolent controlled substance offender from licensure and shall determine each
1.18	applicant's eligibility for licensure on a case-by-case basis based on a background
1.19	investigation. A nonviolent controlled substance offender is a person who meets the criteria
1.20	described under section 244.0513, subdivision 2, clauses (1), (2), and (6).
