Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 245A.11, subdivision 2, is amended to read: 1.5 Subd. 2. Permitted single-family residential use. (a) Residential programs with a 1.6 licensed capacity of six or fewer persons shall be considered a permitted single-family 1.7 residential use of property for the purposes of zoning and other land use regulations, except 1.8 that a residential program whose primary purpose is to treat juveniles who have violated 1.9 criminal statutes relating to sex offenses or have been adjudicated delinquent on the basis 1.10 of conduct in violation of criminal statutes relating to sex offenses shall not be considered 1.11 a permitted use. This exception shall not apply to residential programs licensed before July 1.12 1, 1995. Programs otherwise allowed under this subdivision shall not be prohibited by 1.13 operation of restrictive covenants or similar restrictions, regardless of when entered into, 1.14 which cannot be met because of the nature of the licensed program, including provisions 1.15 which require the home's occupants be related, and that the home must be occupied by the 1.16 owner, or similar provisions. 1.17

(b) Unless otherwise provided in any town, municipal, or county zoning regulation,
licensed residential services provided to more than four persons with developmental
disabilities in a supervised living facility, including intermediate care facilities for persons
with developmental disabilities, with a licensed capacity of seven to eight persons shall be
considered a permitted single-family residential use of property for the purposes of zoning
and other land use regulations. A town, municipal, or county zoning authority may require
