1.5	Section 1. EMERGENCY HOSPITALITY SAFETY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM;
1.6	APPROPRIATION.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Appropriation. (a) \$25,000,000 in fiscal year 2022 is appropriated from
1.8	the general fund to the commissioner of employment and economic development for grants
1.9	under this section. Of this amount, no more than \$ may be used for the administrative
1.10	costs incurred in making these payments.
1.11	(b) Of the amount appropriated in paragraph (a), \$5,000,000 is for grants to minority
1.12	business enterprises, as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 116M.14, subdivision 5, and
1.13	businesses that are majority owned and operated by women.
1.14	(c) This is a onetime appropriation and is available until expended.

2.1	(b) The commissioner of employment and economic development shall make grants on
2.2	a first-come, first-served basis to eligible businesses, with no eligible business receiving a
2.3	grant of more than \$25,000. Grant funds must be used for expenses related to the cost of
2.4	private efforts to keep employees and customers safe. Reimbursable expenses include but
2.5	are not limited to costs related to hiring private security and installing security cameras or
2.6	enhanced lighting.
2.7	(c) Grants and the process of making grants under this section are exempt from the
2.8	following statutes and related policies: Minnesota Statutes, sections 16A.15, subdivision 3;
2.9	16B.97; 16B.98, subdivisions 5, 7, and 8; and 116J.993 to 116J.995. The commissioner of
