1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 121A.035, is amended to read:
1.8	121A.035 CRISIS MANAGEMENT POLICY.
1.9	Subdivision 1. Model policy. The commissioner shall maintain and make available to
1.10	school boards and charter schools a model crisis management policy that includes, among
1.11	other items, cardiac emergency response plans, school lock-down and tornado drills,
1.12	consistent with subdivision 2, and school fire drills under section 299F.30.
1.13	Subd. 2. School district and charter school policy. A school board and a charter school
1.14	must adopt a crisis management policy to address potential violent crisis situations in the
1.15	district or charter school. The policy must be developed cooperatively with administrators,
1.16	teachers, employees, students, parents, community members, law enforcement agencies,
1.17	other emergency management officials, county attorney offices, social service agencies,
1.18	emergency medical responders, and any other appropriate individuals or organizations. The
1.19	policy must include at least five school lock-down drills, five school fire drills consistent
1.20	with section 299F.30, and one tornado drill, and one cardiac emergency response drill
1.21	consistent with section 121A.241.

2.3 Private schools and educational institutions not subject to section 121A.035 must have
2.4 at least five school lock-down drills, five school fire drills consistent with section 299F.30,
2.5 and one tornado drill, and one cardiac emergency response drill consistent with section
2.6 121A.241.

## 2.7 Sec. 3. [121A.241] CARDIAC EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN.

<u>Subdivision 1.</u> Cardiac emergency response plan. (a) For purposes of this section, a
 "cardiac emergency response plan" is a written document that establishes specific steps to
 reduce death from cardiac arrest. A cardiac emergency response plan must integrate
 evidence-based core elements, such as those recommended by the American Heart

2.12 Association in accordance with a published, peer-reviewed journal article or similar

- 2.14 (b) Beginning in the 2025-2026 school year, a school district or charter school must
- 2.15 <u>develop a cardiac emergency response plan that addresses the appropriate use of school</u>
- 2.16 personnel to respond to incidents involving an individual experiencing sudden cardiac arrest
- 2.17 <u>or a similar life-threatening emergency while on school grounds or at a school-sponsored</u>
- 2.18 <u>activity or event. A district or charter school must consult with athletic trainers when</u>
- 2.19 developing the plan. A principal or other person having administrative control over the
- 2.20 school site must ensure that the plan is:
- 2.21 (1) available to the school community on the school website and in paper form at various
  2.22 locations at the school site;
- 2.23 (2) distributed to all coaches and other athletic staff members at each school site, all
- 2.24 persons responsible for executing the plan in the event of a cardiac emergency, all health
- 2.25 <u>care professionals that provide medical services during school-sponsored activities or events,</u>
- 2.26 and to other appropriate school staff, as determined by school administrators; and
- 2.27 (3) annually reviewed, rehearsed, and revised, as necessary.
- 2.28 (c) A cardiac emergency response plan must:
- 2.29 (1) identify the members of a cardiac emergency response team at each school site who
- 2.30 are on duty during the regular school day;
- 2.31 (2) provide guidelines for the cardiac emergency response team's response to sudden

3.1	(3) require that automatic external defibrillators are available for use within close
3.2	proximity to the site of an athletic activity or event, and identify where automatic external
3.3	defibrillators are located at the school site, in accordance with guidelines from the American

3.5	cardiovascular care, and the maintenance schedule for the automatic external defibrillators;
3.6	(4) require training on cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automatic external defibrillator
3.7	use for coaches, assistant coaches, and other school staff identified by school administrators;
3.8	(5) require the emergency response team to participate in a cardiac emergency simulation
3.9	at least 30 days before the beginning of each school year;
3.10	(6) describe the procedures that must be followed after a serious or life-threatening injury
3.11	or cardiac emergency occurs at an athletic event or activity, including but not limited to
3.12	responding to the injured individual, summoning emergency medical care, assisting
3.13	emergency medical service providers, and documenting the actions taken during the
3.14	emergency; and
3.15	(7) encourage cooperation and coordination with community members such as emergency
3.16	medical technicians and paramedics, among others.
3.17	Subd. 2. Training requirements. A school district or charter school must provide all
3.18	members of a cardiac emergency response team with training necessary to implement a
3.19	cardiac emergency response plan.

3.22	Subd. 3c. Cardiac emergency response plan. The league must adopt a cardiac
3.23	emergency response plan that meets the requirements of section 121A.241. The league must
3.24	ensure that a cardiac emergency response team is present at each interscholastic athletic
3.25	activity whose control, supervision, and regulation have been delegated to the Minnesota
3.26	State High School League pursuant to section 128C.01.
