2.3 (1) primary and specialty medical care providers;

2.4 (2) early childhood education and child care programs;

2.5 (3) developmental disabilities assessment and intervention programs;

2.6 (4) mental health services;

2.7 (5) family and social support programs;

2.8 (6) child advocacy and legal services;

2.9 (7) public health services and resources; and

2.10 (8) other appropriate early childhood information.

2.11 (c) The Help Me Grow program shall develop a centralized access point for parents and  
2.12 professionals to obtain information, resources, and other support services.

2.13 (d) The Help Me Grow program shall collect data to increase understanding of all aspects  
2.14 of the current and ongoing system under this section, including identification of gaps in  
2.15 service, barriers to finding and receiving appropriate service, and lack of resources.

2.16 Subd. 4. **Review.** The Departments of Education, Health, and Human Services must  
2.17 annually review the following:

2.18 (1) outcomes achieved by the Help Me Grow program;

2.19 (2) alignment with overall early childhood goals and objectives; and

2.20 (3) impacts on young children.
