1.6	Subdivision 1. Definitions. For the purposes of this section:
1.7	(1) "board" means the Board of Water and Soil Resources; and
1.8	(2) "local units of government" has the meaning given under section 103B.305,
1.9	subdivision 5.
1.10	Subd. 2. Establishment; purpose. The Board of Water and Soil Resources must establish
1.11	a grant program to provide financial assistance to local units of government and private
1.12	landowners to control water volume and rates for the purposes of protecting infrastructure
1.13	and improving water quality and related public benefits.
1.14	Subd. 3. Grants. The board must distribute money appropriated for the purposes of this
1.15	section equally to soil and water conservation districts. Soil and water conservation districts
1.16	must use the money for the purposes of this section and may use the money for:
