1.10	(1) state the full name, date of birth, sex, and either (i) the residence address of the
1.11	applicant, or (ii) designated address under section 5B.05;

1.13	any other facts pertaining to the applicant, the applicant's driving privileges, and the
1.14	applicant's ability to operate a motor vehicle with safety;

Upon a request by an applicant for a driver's license, 2.23 instruction permit, or Minnesota identification card under section 171.06, subdivision 3, 2.24 the commissioner must maintain electronic records of names and contact information for 2.25 up to three emergency contacts for the applicant. The emergency contacts data are classified 2.26 as private data on individuals as defined in section 13.02, subdivision 12, except that this 2.27 information is available to peace officers, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, and 2.28 authorized emergency department staff to notify the emergency contacts regarding an 2.29 emergency. 2.30
