 1.2 relating to waters; designating Shell Rock River for state water trail; amending
 1.3 Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 85.32, subdivision 1.

1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 85.32, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

1.6 Subdivision 1. **Areas marked.** The commissioner of natural resources is authorized
 1.7 in cooperation with local units of government and private individuals and groups when
 1.8 feasible to mark state water trails on the Little Fork, Big Fork, Minnesota, St. Croix,
 1.9 Snake, Mississippi, Red Lake, Cannon, Straight, Des Moines, Crow Wing, St. Louis, Pine,
 1.10 Rum, Kettle, Cloquet, Root, Zumbro, Pomme de Terre within Swift County, Watonwan,
 1.11 Cottonwood, Whitewater, Chippewa from Benson in Swift County to Montevideo in
 1.12 Chippewa County, Long Prairie, Red River of the North, Sauk, Otter Tail, Redwood,
 1.13 Blue Earth, Cedar, Shell Rock, and Crow Rivers which have historic and scenic values
 1.14 and to mark appropriately points of interest, portages, camp sites, and all dams, rapids,
 1.15 waterfalls, whirlpools, and other serious hazards which are dangerous to canoe, kayak,
 1.16 and watercraft travelers.
