1.9	charter school, state agency, public library, or university may offer digital or online library
1.10	database resources to students in kindergarten through grade 12 only if the vendor or other
1.11	person or entity providing the resources verifies that all the resources will comply with the
1.12	provisions of subdivision 2.
1.13	Subd. 2. Safety policies. (a) Digital or online library database resources offered by
1.14	school districts, public charter schools, state agencies, public libraries, or universities to
1.15	students in kindergarten through grade 12 must have safety policies and technology protection
1.16	measures that:
1.17	(1) prohibit and prevent a user of the resource from sending, receiving, viewing, or
1.18	downloading materials that are deemed to be harmful to minors, as defined by section
1.19	<u>617.291; and</u>
1.20	(2) filter or block access to obscene materials, materials harmful to minors, and materials
