1.5	Section 1. APPROPRIATION; SOMALI MENTAL HEALTH PILOT PROJECT.
1.6	(a) \$900,000 in fiscal year 2022 and \$900,000 in fiscal year 2023 are appropriated from
1.7	the general fund to the commissioner of human services for a grant to the Intercultural
1.8	Mutual Assistance Association for a pilot project in Rochester to provide mental health
1.9	education and support services to Somali students and mothers. This is a onetime
1.10	appropriation. The Intercultural Mutual Assistance Association will partner with the
1.11	Rochester Math and Science Academy and the Somali American Social Service Association
1.12	to implement the pilot project.
1.13	(b) As part of the pilot project, the Intercultural Mutual Assistance Association and its
1.14	partners shall:
1.15	(1) expand a dialectical behavioral therapy skills in schools pilot program for 20 or more
1.16	additional students attending the Rochester Math and Science Academy and offer the program
