1.2 relating to labor and industry; requiring a prevailing wage for certain financial
1.3 assistance; amending Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 116J.871,
1.4 subdivision 1.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 116J.871, subdivision 1, is
1.7 amended to read:

1.8 Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms have
1.9 the meanings given them.

1.10 (b) "Economic development" means financial assistance provided to a person directly
1.11 or to a local unit of government or nonprofit organization on behalf of a person who is
1.12 engaged in the manufacture or sale of goods and services. Economic development does not
1.13 include (1) financial assistance for rehabilitation of existing housing; (2) financial assistance
1.14 for new housing construction in which total financial assistance at a single project site is
1.15 less than \$100,000; or (3) financial assistance for the new construction of fully detached
1.16 single-family affordable homeownership units for which the financial assistance covers no
1.17 more than ten fully detached single-family affordable homeownership units. For purposes
1.18 of this paragraph, "affordable homeownership" means housing targeted at households with
1.19 incomes, at initial occupancy, at or below 115 percent of the state or area median income,
1.20 whichever is greater, as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban
1.21 Development.

1.22 (c) "Financial assistance" means (1) a grant awarded by a state agency for economic
1.23 development related purposes if a single business receives \$200,000 or more of the grant

2.1 proceeds; (2) a loan or the guaranty or purchase of a loan made by a state agency for
2.2 economic development related purposes if a single business receives \$500,000 or more of
2.3 the loan proceeds; ~~or~~ (3) a reduction, credit, or abatement of a tax assessed under chapter
2.4 297A where the tax reduction, credit, or abatement applies to a geographic area smaller
2.5 than the entire state and was granted for economic development related purposes; or (4) tax
2.6 increment financing under section 469.174 provided that such tax increment financing (i)
2.7 provides financial assistance to a development that consists, in part or in whole, of 25 units
2.8 or more of multifamily housing, or (ii) provides \$100,000 or more of financial assistance
2.9 to a development of any number of units of multifamily housing. Financial assistance does
2.10 not include payments by the state of aids and credits under chapter 273 or 477A to a political
2.11 subdivision.

2.12 (d) "Project site" means the location where improvements are made that are financed in
2.13 whole or in part by the financial assistance; or the location of employees that receive financial
2.14 assistance in the form of employment and training services as defined in section 116L.19,
2.15 subdivision 4, or customized training from a technical college.

2.16 (e) "State agency" means any agency defined under section 16B.01, subdivision 2,
2.17 Enterprise Minnesota, Inc., and the Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation Board.

2.18 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective for financial assistance provided after
2.19 August 1, 2024, unless a request for proposal for a project covered under paragraph (c),
2.20 clause (4), was initiated prior to August 1, 2024.
