### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 169.011, subdivision 94, is amended to read:

Subd. 94. Wireless communications device. "Wireless communications device" means 1.8 (1) a cellular phone, or (2) a portable electronic device that is capable of receiving and 1.9 transmitting data, including but not limited to text messages and e-mail, without an access 1.10 line for service. A wireless communications device does not include a device or feature that 1.11 is permanently affixed to physically integrated into the vehicle, or including a global 1.12 positioning system or navigation system when the system is used exclusively for navigation 1.13

#### 169.475 USE OF WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS DEVICE.

Subdivision 1. **Definition Definitions.** (a) For purposes of this section, the following 1.17 terms have the meanings given. 1.18

(b) "Electronic message" means a self-contained piece of digital communication that is designed or intended to be transmitted between physical devices. An electronic message includes, but is not limited to;: e-mail;; a text message;; an instant message;; a command or request to access a World Wide web page, or; a voice mail message; a transmitted image;
