ranking minority members of the legislative
committees and divisions with jurisdiction
over environment and natural resources and
agriculture. The general fund base in fiscal
year 2024 and later is \$282,000.

(d) \$200,000 the first year and \$200,000 the

recreation programs serving youth under
Minnesota Statutes, section 84.976. These are
onetime appropriations.
