1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. STANDARDIZED ASSESSMENT TASK FORCE.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The Standardized Assessment Task Force is established
1.7	to recommend to the Minnesota legislature changes to make Minnesota's standardized
1.8	assessment system more meaningful, reliable, and useful for schools, students, and families.
1.9	Subd. 2. Duties. (a) The task force must review statewide assessments, state and federal
1.10	academic accountability requirements, assessments used in other states, and Department of
1.11	Education practices and procedures related to standardized testing to make recommendations
1.12	for changes to Minnesota's standardized assessments requirements.
1.13	(b) In making recommendations, the task force must consider:
1.14	(1) the number of students who do not participate in statewide assessments and the effect
1.15	on standardized assessment performance reports;
1.16	(2) the time, financial costs, and other resources school districts expend on administering
1.17	standardized assessments;
1.18	(3) how standardized assessment data is used at the school site, school district, and state
1.19	level; and
1.20	(4) how standardized assessments may be used to identify achievement gaps among
1.21	groups of students, increase proficiency, or close achievement gaps.
