1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 609.25, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.6	Subd. 2. <b>Sentence.</b> Whoever violates subdivision 1 may be sentenced as follows:
1.7	(1) if the victim is released in a safe place without great bodily harm, to imprisonment
1.8	for not more than 20 years or to payment of a fine of not more than \$35,000, or both; or
1.9	(2) if the victim is not released in a safe place, or if the victim suffers great bodily harm
1.10	during the course of the kidnapping, or if the person kidnapped is under the age of 16, to
1.11	imprisonment for not more than 40 years or to payment of a fine of not more than \$50,000,
1.12	or both if:
1.13	(i) the victim is not released in a safe place;
1.14	(ii) the victim suffers great bodily harm during the course of the kidnapping; or
1.15	(iii) the person kidnapped is under the age of 16.
