1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 144.293, subdivision 5, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 5. Exceptions to consent requirement. (a) This section does not prohibit the
1.8	release of health records:
1.9	(1) for a medical emergency when the provider is unable to obtain the patient's consent
1.10	due to the patient's condition or the nature of the medical emergency;
1.11	(2) to other providers within related health care entities when necessary for the current
1.12	treatment of the patient by those entities or individuals subject to Code of Federal
1.13	Regulations, title 45, part 164, subpart E, for treatment, payment, or health care operations
1.14	consistent with subpart E; or
1.15	(3) to a health care facility licensed by this chapter, chapter 144A, or to the same types
1.16	of health care facilities licensed by this chapter and chapter 144A that are licensed in another
1.17	state when a patient:
