| 1.6        | Section 1. [120B.121] MINNESOTA READS TASK FORCE.  |
| 1.7        | Subdivision 1. Membership. The Minnesota Reads task force must consist of 15 public  |
| 1.8        | members.   |
| 1.9        | Subd. 2. Public members. (a) The commissioner must appoint, in the manner provided   |
| 1.10       | in section 15.0597, 15 public members, including the following:  |
| 1.11       | (1) two elementary reading teachers;   |
| 1.12       | (2) two adult basic education literacy teachers;   |
| 1.13       | (3) two literacy researchers;  |
| 1.14       | (4) two school administrators;   |
| 1.15       | (5) two parents or guardians of elementary-aged children;  |
| 1.16       | (6) two students;  |
| 1.17       | (7) two members representing Minnesota businesses; and   |
| 1.18       | (8) one other member from any of the categories described in clauses (1) to (7).   |
| 1.19       | (b) Task force membership must include, where possible, representation that is racially,   |
| 1.20       | culturally, linguistically, geographically, and economically diverse.  |

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| 2.1  | (c) The first appointments must be made by August 15, 2019.                                  |
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| 2.2  | Subd. 3. Term. Members of the task force must serve for a term of three years and may        |
| 2.3  | be reappointed. Members must serve until their successors have been appointed.               |
| 2.4  | Subd. 4. Administration. The commissioner or the commissioner's designee must                |
| 2.5  | provide meeting space and administrative services for the task force. The commissioner or    |
| 2.6  | the commissioner's designee must convene the first meeting of the task force no later than   |
| 2.7  | September 15, 2019.  |
| 2.8  | Subd. 5. Chairs. At the task force's first meeting, and biannually thereafter, the members   |
| 2.9  | must elect a chair and a vice-chair whose duties shall be established by the task force.     |
| 2.10 | Subd. 6. Meeting. The task force must meet periodically.                                     |
| 2.11 | Subd. 7. No compensation; expenses. Public members of the task force serve without           |
| 2.12 | compensation but are eligible for reimbursement for expenses consistent with section 15.059, |
| 2.13 | subdivision 6.   |
| 2.14 | Subd. 8. Duties. (a) The task force must consult with and advise the commissioner on         |
| 2.15 | matters related to the development, implementation, and evaluation of programs designed      |
| 2.16 | to increase the reading proficiency of children and adults, including prenatal programs,     |
| 2.17 | programs for school-age children, and programs for adult learners. The task force must       |
| 2.18 | advise the commissioner on strategies to increase grade 3 reading proficiency rates and      |
| 2.19 | adult literacy rates to 100 percent by 2025.   |
| 2.20 | (b) By February 15 of each year, the task force must submit to the chairs and ranking        |
| 2.21 | minority members of the committees of the senate and the house of representatives with       |
| 2.22 | primary jurisdiction over prekindergarten through grade 12 education a report containing:    |
| 2.23 | (1) the task force's assessment of the state's literacy programs for children and adults;    |
| 2.24 | (2) the task force's assessment of the state's literacy outcomes for children and adults;    |

| 2.26 | (3) recommendations for legislative action, with draft legislation to implement the          |
| 2.27 | recommendations.   |
| 2.28 | (c) The Department of Education must publish the report each year on the department's        |
| 2.29 | website.   |
| 2.30 | Subd. 9. Open meetings. The task force is subject to the requirements of chapter 13D.        |
| 2.31 | Subd. 10. Expiration. The task force does not expire.  |
