1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.13, subdivision 7, is amended to read:
1.9	Subd. 7. Repeat Examination fee fees. (a) A fee of \$10 must be paid by an individual
1.10	to take a third and any subsequent knowledge test administered by the department if the
1.11	individual has failed two previous consecutive knowledge tests on the subject.
1.12	(b) A fee of \$20 must be paid by an individual to take a third and any subsequent skills
1.13	or road test administered by the department if the individual has previously failed two
1.14	consecutive skill or road tests in a specified class of motor vehicle.
1.15	(c) <u>A fee of \$20 must be paid by an individual who fails to appear for a scheduled skills</u>
1.16	or road test or who cancels a skills or road test within 24 hours of the appointment time.
1.17	(d) All fees received under this subdivision must be paid into the state treasury and
1.18	credited to the driver services operating account in the special revenue fund specified under
1.19	section 299A.705.
