

1.1 A bill for an act

1.2 relating to state government; requiring a Web site with a searchable database of
1.3 state expenditures; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter
1.4 16A; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 16C.046.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. [16A.056] WEB SITE WITH SEARCHABLE DATABASE ON STATE
1.7 EXPENDITURES.

1.8 Subdivision 1. Web database requirement. The commissioner, in consultation
1.9 with the commissioners of administration and revenue and the legislative auditor, must
1.10 maintain a Web site with a searchable database providing the public with information on
1.11 state contracts, state appropriations, state expenditures, state tax expenditures, and state
1.12 entities that are the subject of audits. For each data field identified in subdivisions 2 to 6,
1.13 the searchable database must allow a user of the Web site to:

1.14 (1) perform a search using that field;

1.15 (2) sort by that field;

1.16 (3) obtain information grouped or aggregated by that field, where groups or subtotals
1.17 are feasible; and

1.18 (4) view information in that field by each fiscal year or an aggregation of fiscal years.

1.19 Subd. 2. Contracts. (a) The searchable database on the Web site must include
1.20 at least the following data fields:

1.21 (1) the name of the entity receiving the contract;

1.22 (2) the name of the agency entering into the contract;

1.23 (3) an indication if the contract is for (i) goods; (ii) professional or technical services;
1.24 (iii) services other than professional and technical services; or (iv) a grant; and

2.1 (4) the fund or funds from which the entity receiving the contract will be paid.

2.2 (b) For each contract, the database must also include:

2.3 (1) an address for each entity receiving a contract; and

2.4 (2) a brief statement of the purpose of the contract or grant.

2.5 (c) Information on a new contract or grant must be entered into the database within

2.6 30 days of the time the contract or grant is entered into.

2.7 (d) For purposes of this section, a "grant" is a contract between a state agency and

2.8 a recipient, the primary purpose of which is to transfer cash or a thing of value to the

2.9 recipient to support a public purpose. Grant does not include aid payments to units of local

2.10 governments, payments to state employees, or payments made under laws providing for

2.11 assistance to individuals.

2.12 Subd. 3. **Appropriations.** The searchable database on the Web site must include

2.13 at least the following data fields on state appropriations:

2.14 (1) the agency receiving the appropriation, or the name of the nonstate entity

2.15 receiving the appropriation;

2.16 (2) the agency program, to the extent applicable;

2.17 (3) the agency activity, to the extent applicable;

2.18 (4) an item within an activity if applicable;

2.19 (5) the fund from which the appropriation is made; and

2.20 (6) the object of expenditure.

2.21 Subd. 4. **State expenditures.** The searchable database on the Web site must include

2.22 at least the following data fields on state expenditures:

2.23 (1) the agency making the expenditure, or the name of the nonstate entity making

2.24 the appropriation;

2.25 (2) the agency program, to the extent applicable;

2.26 (3) the agency activity, to the extent applicable;

2.27 (4) an item within an activity if applicable;

2.28 (5) the fund from which the expenditure is made; and

2.29 (6) the object of expenditure.

2.30 Subd. 5. **Tax expenditures.** The Web site must include a searchable database of

2.31 state tax expenditures. For each fiscal year, the database must include data fields showing

2.32 the estimated impact on state revenues of each tax expenditure item listed in the report

2.33 prepared under section 270C.11.

2.34 Subd. 6. **Audits.** The searchable database on the Web site must include at least the

2.35 following data fields for pending and completed audits of state agencies:

2.36 (1) the agency that is the subject of the audit;

- 3.1 (2) the program or activity that is the subject of the audit, if applicable;
3.2 (3) the entity performing the audit;
3.3 (4) the estimated completion date for an audit not yet completed; and
3.4 (5) a link to a Web site containing the findings and results from the completed audit
3.5 after it has been released to the public.

3.6 Subd. 7. **Retention of data.** The database required under this section must include
3.7 information beginning with fiscal year 2010 funds and must retain data for at least ten
3.8 years.

3.9 Subd. 8. **Consultation.** The commissioner of finance must consult with the
3.10 chairs of the house of representatives Ways and Means and senate Finance Committees
3.11 before encumbering any funds appropriated on or after July 1, 2009, for the planning,
3.12 development, and implementation of state accounting or procurement systems. No funds
3.13 appropriated for these purposes may be spent unless the commissioner certifies that the
3.14 systems will allow compliance with requirements of this section.

3.16 Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 16C.046, is repealed.

**16C.046 WEB SITE; SEARCHABLE DATABASE; STATE CONTRACTS;
GRANTS.**

(a) The commissioner of administration must maintain a Web site with a searchable database providing the public with information on state contracts, including grant contracts. The database must include the following information for each state contract valued in excess of \$25,000:

- (1) the name and address of the entity receiving the contract;
- (2) the name of the agency entering into the contract;
- (3) whether the contract is:
 - (i) for goods;
 - (ii) for professional or technical services;
 - (iii) for services other than professional and technical services; or
 - (iv) a grant;
- (4) a brief statement of the purpose of the contract or grant;
- (5) the amount of the contract or grant and the fund from which this amount will be paid; and
- (6) the dollar value of state contracts, other than grants, the entity has received in each fiscal year and the dollar value of state grants the entity has received in each fiscal year.

(b) Required information on a new contract or grant must be entered into the database within 30 days of the time the contract is entered into.

(c) For purposes of this section, a "grant" is a contract between a state agency and a recipient, the primary purpose of which is to transfer cash or a thing of value to the recipient to support a public purpose. Grant does not include payments to units of local government, payments to state employees, or payments made under laws providing for assistance to individuals.

(d) The database must include information on grants and contracts entered into beginning with fiscal year 2008 funds, and must retain that data for ten years.
