1.6	Section 1. TRANSPORTATION PROJECT SELECTION PROCESS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Adoption of best practices. (a) The commissioner of transportation,
1.8	after consultation with the Federal Highway Administration, metropolitan planning
1.9	organizations, regional development commissions, area transportation partnerships, local
1.10	governments, the Metropolitan Council, and transportation stakeholders, must develop,
