BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

## Section 1. TASK FORCE ON MISSING AND MURDERED AFRICAN AMERICAN WOMEN.

Subdivision 1. Creation and duties. (a) By September 1, 2021, the commissioner, in consultation with the Council for Minnesotans of African Heritage, shall appoint members to the Task Force on Missing and Murdered African American Women to advise the commissioner and report to the legislature on recommendations to reduce and end violence against African American women and girls in Minnesota. The task force may also serve as a liaison between the commissioner and agencies and nongovernmental organizations that provide services to victims, victims' families, and victims' communities. Task force members may receive expense reimbursement as specified in Minnesota Statutes, section 15.059, subdivision 6.

- (b) The Task Force on Missing and Murdered African American Women must examine and report on the following:
- (1) the systemic causes behind violence that African American women and girls experience, including patterns and underlying factors that explain why disproportionately high levels of violence occur against African American women and girls, including
