BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA: 1.4 Section 1. FLOOD HAZARD MITIGATION GRANTS; APPROPRIATIONS. 1.5 Subdivision 1. **Appropriation.** (a) \$17,000,000 is appropriated from the bond 1.6 proceeds fund to the commissioner of natural resources for the state share of flood hazard 1.7 mitigation grants for publicly owned capital improvements to prevent or alleviate flood 1.8 damages under Minnesota Statutes, section 103F.161.
