1.5	Section 1. HUMAN SERVICES FINANCING REFORM TASK FORCE.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment; purpose. There is established the Human Services
1.7	Financing Reform Task Force for the Department of Human Services. The purpose of the
1.8	task force is to:
1.9	(1) analyze total human services funding by the state and counties since 2000; and
1.10	(2) make recommendations to the commissioner of human services and the legislature
1.11	on options for creating a financing framework for state and county support, health, and
1.12	social services programs that promotes transparency, equitable resource allocation that takes
1.13	into consideration relative tax capacity, and a sustainable system of services focused on
1.14	positive outcomes for Minnesota residents.
