(a) The following towns and cities may provide balloting 1.7 by mail at any municipal, county, or state election with no polling place other than the office 1.8 of the auditor or clerk or other locations designated by the auditor or clerk: 1.9 (1) a town of any size not located in a metropolitan county as defined by section 473.121; 1.10 (2) a town having fewer than 2,000 registered voters on June 1 of an election year and 1.11 located in a metropolitan county as defined by section 473.121; or 1.12 (3) a city having fewer than 400 registered voters on June 1 of an election year and not 1.13 located in a metropolitan county as defined by section 473.121, may provide balloting by 1 14 mail at any municipal, county, or state election with no polling place other than the office 1.15 of the auditor or clerk or other locations designated by the auditor or clerk. 1.16 The governing body may apply to the county auditor for permission to conduct balloting 1.17 by mail.
