1.6	(a) \$500,000 in fiscal year 2019, \$750,000 in fiscal year 2020, and \$750,000 in fiscal
1.7	year 2021 are appropriated from the general fund to the Board of Water and Soil Resources
1.8	to provide cost-share grants to landowners to plant residential lawns with native vegetation
1.9	and pollinator-friendly forbs and legumes. The board must establish criteria for grants
1.10	awarded under this section. Criteria established under this section are not subject to the
1.11	rulemaking provisions of Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14, and Minnesota Statutes, section
1.12	14.386, does not apply. Grants awarded under this section may be made for up to 75 percent
