1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 609.7475, subdivision 3, is amended to read:
1.9	Subd. 3. Penalties. (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), a person who violates
1.10	subdivision 2 is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.
1.11	(b) A person who violates subdivision 2 is guilty of a felony and may be sentenced
1.12	to imprisonment for not more than five years or to payment of a fine of not more than
1.13	\$10,000, or both, if the person:
1.14	(1) commits the offense with intent to influence or otherwise tamper with a juror
1.15	or a judicial proceeding or with intent to retaliate against:
1.16	(i) a judicial officer, as defined in section 609.415;
1.17	(ii) a prosecutor, defense attorney, or officer of the court, because of that person's
1.18	performance of official duties in connection with a judicial proceeding;
1.19	(iii) a sheriff or deputy sheriff because of that person's performance of official duties

## 2.5 EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2014, and applies to crimes 2.6 committed on or after that date.
