1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. [299A.86] OFFICE OF ANIMAL PROTECTION.
1.7	Subdivision 1. <b>Definitions.</b> As used in this section, the following terms have the meanings
1.8	given.
1.9	(a) "Animal" means an animal commonly kept as a pet in households in the United
1.10	States, including dogs, cats, rabbits, guinea pigs, ferrets, small rodents, small nonnative
1.11	birds, and small nonvenomous amphibians and reptiles.
1.12	(b) "Animal rescue" means any person, group, agency, society, firm, or corporation that
1.13	takes in, accepts, or receives animals that are unwanted, surrendered, strayed, abandoned,
1.14	obtained from municipalities, or purchased, with the intent or purpose of subsequently
1.15	placing the animals in permanent homes. An animal rescue keeps animals in a person's
1.16	private home until a permanent home is found for the animals. An animal rescue does not
1.17	generally use a central facility to house animals.
1.18	(c) "Animal shelter" means any place, building, tract of land, abode, or vehicle where
1.19	animals are taken in, accepted, or received and kept that are unwanted, surrendered, strayed,
1.20	abandoned, obtained from municipalities, or purchased, with the intent or purpose of
1.21	subsequently placing them in permanent homes. Animal shelter does not include a person's
1.22	home where animals are kept as pets solely for the person's own use or enjoyment.

2.3	Subd. 2. Establishment. The commissioner of public safety shall establish and maintain
2.4	the Office of Animal Protection as an office within the Department of Public Safety.
2.5	Subd. 3. Director; staff. (a) The commissioner of public safety must appoint as a director
2.6	a person who is highly qualified and knowledgeable about law enforcement, animal welfare,
2.7	the prevention of animal cruelty, rescuing and providing temporary shelter to animals, and

2.9	(b) The director may select, appoint, and compensate out of available funds assistants
2.10	and employees, including animal protection officers, as necessary to discharge the office's

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Subd. 8. Reports. (a) The office must report annually to the legislative committees with
jurisdiction over animals on grants made under subdivision 7 in the previous calendar year
The report must include the amounts of the grants issued, the geographic distribution of the
grants, and measurable outcomes including the number of education and outreach programs
conducted and the number of animals served.
(b) On or before November 1 of each year, the office must publish and make available
an annual report on the office's efforts to:
.8 (1) protect the welfare of animals;
.9 (2) enforce laws related to animal welfare and the prevention of animal cruelty;
.10 (3) train professionals on preventing animal crimes;
(4) develop and maintain a statewide dangerous dog database; and
(5) investigate violations of the laws for dangerous dogs.
Subd. 9. Money received from other sources; gifts. The office may accept and use
gifts, grants, or contributions from any source to support the office. The office may apply
for and accept grants of money from the United States, the state, a subdivision of the state
a foundation, or a person for any of the office's purposes. Money received directly for the
Office of Animal Protection must be deposited in the Office of Animal Protection account
in the special revenue fund for use by the office.
19 Subd. 10. Office of Animal Protection account; appropriation. An Office of Anima
Protection account is created in the special revenue fund. All fees and penalties collected
by the office under this chapter, money received by the office as gifts or grants, or other
private or public funds obtained for the purposes of this section must be deposited in the
23 state treasury and credited to the Office of Animal Protection account in the special revenue
fund. Money in the account, including interest on the account, is annually appropriated to
the office for the purposes of this section.
