1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 515B.1-103, is amended to read:
1.8	515B.1-103 DEFINITIONS.
1.9	In the declaration and bylaws, unless specifically provided otherwise or the context
1.10	otherwise requires, and in this chapter:
1.11	(1) "Additional real estate" means real estate that may be added to a flexible common
1.12	interest community.
1.13	(2) "Affiliate of a declarant" means any person who controls, is controlled by, or is under
1.14	common control with a declarant.
1.15	(A) A person "controls" a declarant if the person (i) is a general partner, officer, director,
1.16	or employer of the declarant, (ii) directly or indirectly or acting in concert with one or more
1.17	other persons, or through one or more subsidiaries, owns, controls, holds with power to
1.18	vote, or holds proxies representing, more than 20 percent of the voting interest in the
1.19	declarant, (iii) controls in any manner the election of a majority of the directors of the
1.20	declarant, or (iv) has contributed more than 20 percent of the capital of the declarant.
1.21	(B) A person "is controlled by" a declarant if the declarant (i) is a general partner, officer,
1.22	director, or employer of the person, (ii) directly or indirectly or acting in concert with one
1.23	or more other persons, or through one or more subsidiaries, owns, controls, holds with

power to vote, or holds proxies representing, more than 20 percent of the voting interest in

2.5 a security interest and have not been exercised.

(3) "Allocated interests" means the following interests allocated to each unit: (i) in a
condominium, the undivided interest in the common elements, the common expense liability,
and votes in the association; (ii) in a cooperative, the common expense liability and the
ownership interest and votes in the association; and (iii) in a planned community, the common
expense liability and votes in the association.

2.11 (4) "Association" means the unit owners' association organized under section 515B.3-101.

2.12 (5) "Board" means the body, regardless of name, designated in the articles of
2.13 incorporation, bylaws or declaration to act on behalf of the association, or on behalf of a
2.14 master association when so identified.

2.15 (6) "CIC plat" means a common interest community plat described in section 515B.2-110.

2.16 (7) "Common elements" means all portions of the common interest community other2.17 than the units.

2.18 (8) "Common expenses" means expenditures made or liabilities incurred by or on behalf
2.19 of the association, or master association when so identified, together with any allocations
2.20 to reserves.

2.21 (9) "Common expense liability" means the liability for common expenses allocated to2.22 each unit pursuant to section 515B.2-108.

(10) "Common interest community" or "CIC" means contiguous or noncontiguous real 2.23 estate within Minnesota that is subject to an instrument which obligates persons owning a 2.24 separately described parcel of the real estate, or occupying a part of the real estate pursuant 2.25 to a proprietary lease, by reason of their ownership or occupancy, to pay for (i) real estate 2.26 taxes levied against; (ii) insurance premiums payable with respect to; (iii) maintenance of; 2.27 or (iv) construction, maintenance, repair or replacement of improvements located on, one 2.28 or more parcels or parts of the real estate other than the parcel or part that the person owns 2.29 or occupies. Real estate which satisfies the definition of a common interest community is 2.30 a common interest community whether or not it is subject to this chapter. Real estate subject 2.31 to a master declaration, regardless of when the master declaration was recorded, shall not 2.32

- 3.3 (11) "Condominium" means a common interest community in which (i) portions of the
 3.4 real estate are designated as units, (ii) the remainder of the real estate is designated for
 3.5 common ownership solely by the owners of the units, and (iii) undivided interests in the
 3.6 common elements are vested in the unit owners.
- 3.7 (11a) "Construction defect claim" means a civil action or an arbitration proceeding based
 3.8 on any legal theory including, but not limited to, claims under chapter 327A for damages,

3.21 (15) "Declarant" means:

(i) if the common interest community has been created, (A) any person who has executed

interests in the real estate will not be transferred to unit owners, or, in the case of a leasehold
common interest community, a lessor who possesses no special declarant rights and who

who reserves, or succeeds under section 515B.3-104 to any special declarant rights; or

3.29 (ii) any person or persons acting in concert who have offered prior to creation of the

3.32 (16) "Declaration" means any instrument, however denominated, that creates a common
3.33 interest community.

4.1 (16a) "Development party" means an architect, contractor, construction manager,
4.2 subcontractor, developer, declarant, engineer, or inspector performing or furnishing the
4.3 design, supervision, inspection, construction, coordination, or observation of the construction
4.4 of any improvement to real property that is part of a common interest community, or any

- 4.5 of the person's affiliates, officers, directors, shareholders, members, or employees.
- 4.6 (17) "Dispose" or "disposition" means a voluntary transfer to a purchaser of any legal
 4.7 or equitable interest in the common interest community, but the term does not include the
 4.8 transfer or release of a security interest.
- 4.9 (18) "Flexible common interest community" means a common interest community to4.10 which additional real estate may be added.
- 4.11 (19) "Leasehold common interest community" means a common interest community in
 4.12 which all or a portion of the real estate is subject to a lease the expiration or termination of
 4.13 which will terminate the common interest community or reduce its size.
- 4.14 (20) "Limited common element" means a portion of the common elements allocated by
 4.15 the declaration or by operation of section 515B.2-109(c) or (d) for the exclusive use of one
 4.16 or more but fewer than all of the units.
- (21) "Master association" means an entity created on or after June 1, 1994, that directly 4.17 or indirectly exercises any of the powers set forth in section 515B.3-102 on behalf of one 4.18 or more members described in section 515B.2-121(b), (i), (ii) or (iii), whether or not it also 4.19 exercises those powers on behalf of one or more property owners' associations described 4.20 in section 515B.2-121(b)(iv). A person (i) hired by an association to perform maintenance, 4.21 repair, accounting, bookkeeping or management services, or (ii) granted authority under an 4.22 instrument recorded primarily for the purpose of creating rights or obligations with respect 4.23 to utilities, access, drainage, or recreational amenities, is not, solely by reason of that 4.24 relationship, a master association. 4.25
- 4.26 (22) "Master declaration" means a written instrument, however named, (i) recorded on
 4.27 or after June 1, 1994, and (ii) complying with section 515B.2-121, subsection (e).

(23) "Master developer" means a person who is designated in the master declaration as
a master developer or, in the absence of such a designation, the owner or owners of the real
estate subject to the master declaration at the time the master declaration is recorded, except
(i) secured parties and (ii) a spouse holding only an inchoate interest. A master developer
is not a declarant unless the master declaration states that the real estate subject to the master
declaration collectively is or collectively will be a separate common interest community.

5.4 (25) "Person" means an individual, corporation, limited liability company, partnership,

5.6 governmental subdivision or agency, or other legal or commercial entity capable of holding

5.7 title to real estate.

5.8 (26) "Planned community" means a common interest community that is not a
5.9 condominium or a cooperative. A condominium or cooperative may be a part of a planned

5.11 (27) "Proprietary lease" means an agreement with a cooperative association whereby a
 5.12 member of the association is entitled to exclusive possession of a unit in the cooperative.

5.13 (28) "Purchaser" means a person, other than a declarant, who by means of a voluntary
5.14 transfer acquires a legal or equitable interest in a unit other than (i) a leasehold interest of
5.15 less than 20 years, including renewal options, or (ii) a security interest.

(29) "Real estate" means any fee simple, leasehold or other estate or interest in, over,
or under land, including structures, fixtures, and other improvements and interests that by
custom, usage, or law pass with a conveyance of land though not described in the contract
of sale or instrument of conveyance. "Real estate" may include spaces with or without upper
or lower boundaries, or spaces without physical boundaries.

5.21 (30) "Residential use" means use as a dwelling, whether primary, secondary or seasonal,
5.22 but not transient use such as hotels or motels.

5.23 (31) "Secured party" means the person owning a security interest as defined in paragraph5.24 (32).

(32) "Security interest" means a perfected interest in real estate or personal property, 5.25 created by contract or conveyance, which secures payment or performance of an obligation. 5.26 5.27 The term includes a mortgagee's interest in a mortgage, a vendor's interest in a contract for deed, a lessor's interest in a lease intended as security, a holder's interest in a sheriff's 5.28 certificate of sale during the period of redemption, an assignee's interest in an assignment 5.29 of leases or rents intended as security, in a cooperative, a lender's interest in a member's 5.30 ownership interest in the association, a pledgee's interest in the pledge of an ownership 5.31 interest, or any other interest intended as security for an obligation under a written agreement. 5.32

7.14	(34) "Time share" means a right to occupy a unit or any of several units during three or
7.15	more separate time periods over a period of at least three years, including renewal options,
7.16	whether or not coupled with a fee title interest in the common interest community or a
7.17	specified portion thereof.
7.18	(35) "Unit" means a portion of a common interest community the boundaries of which
7.19	are described in the common interest community's declaration and which is intended for
7.20	separate ownership, or separate occupancy pursuant to a proprietary lease.
7.21	(36) "Unit identifier" means English letters or Arabic numerals, or a combination thereof,
7.22	which identify only one unit in a common interest community and which meet the
7.23	requirements of section 515B.2-104.
7.24	(37) "Unit owner" means a declarant or other person who owns a unit, a lessee under a
7.25	proprietary lease, or a lessee of a unit in a leasehold common interest community whose
7.26	lease expires simultaneously with any lease the expiration or termination of which will
7.27	remove the unit from the common interest community, but does not include a secured party.

7.31 **515B.3-102 POWERS OF UNIT OWNERS' ASSOCIATION.**

as introduced

(a) Except as provided in subsections (b) and, (c), (d), and (e), and subject to the
provisions of the declaration or bylaws, the association shall have the power to:

(1) adopt, amend and revoke rules and regulations not inconsistent with the articles of 8.3 incorporation, bylaws and declaration, as follows: (i) regulating the use of the common 8.4 elements; (ii) regulating the use of the units, and conduct of unit occupants, which may 8.5 jeopardize the health, safety or welfare of other occupants, which involves noise or other 8.6 disturbing activity, or which may damage the common elements or other units; (iii) regulating 8.7 or prohibiting animals; (iv) regulating changes in the appearance of the common elements 8.8 and conduct which may damage the common interest community; (v) regulating the exterior 8.9 appearance of the common interest community, including, for example, balconies and patios, 8.10 window treatments, and signs and other displays, regardless of whether inside a unit; (vi) 8.11 implementing the articles of incorporation, declaration and bylaws, and exercising the 8.12 powers granted by this section; and (vii) otherwise facilitating the operation of the common 8.13 interest community; 8.14

8.17 (3) hire and discharge managing agents and other employees, agents, and independent8.18 contractors;

(4) institute, defend, or intervene in litigation or administrative proceedings (i) in its
own name on behalf of itself or two or more unit owners on matters affecting the common
elements or other matters affecting the common interest community or, (ii) with the consent
of the owners of the affected units on matters affecting only those units;

8.23 (5) make contracts and incur liabilities;

8.24 (6) regulate the use, maintenance, repair, replacement, and modification of the common
8.25 elements and the units;

8.26 (7) cause improvements to be made as a part of the common elements, and, in the case8.27 of a cooperative, the units;

(8) acquire, hold, encumber, and convey in its own name any right, title, or interest to
real estate or personal property, but (i) common elements in a condominium or planned
community may be conveyed or subjected to a security interest only pursuant to section
515B.3-112, or (ii) part of a cooperative may be conveyed, or all or part of a cooperative
may be subjected to a security interest, only pursuant to section 515B.3-112;

9.1 (9) grant or amend easements for public utilities, public rights-of-way or other public

18.8 (b) A declarant warrants to a purchaser that:

(1) a unit and the common elements in the common interest community are suitable forthe ordinary uses of real estate of its type; and

(2) any improvements subject to use rights by the purchaser, made or contracted for by
the declarant, or made by any person in contemplation of the creation of the common interest
community, will be (i) free from defective materials and (ii) constructed in accordance with
applicable law, according to sound engineering and construction standards, and in a
workmanlike manner.

(c) In addition, a declarant warrants to a purchaser of a unit which under the declaration
is available for residential use that the residential use will not violate applicable law at the
earlier of the time of conveyance or delivery of possession.

(d) Warranties imposed by this section may be excluded or modified only as specifiedin section 515B.4-114.

(e) For purposes of this section, improvements made or contracted for by an affiliate ofa declarant are made or contracted for by the declarant.

person violates any provision of this chapter, or any provision of the declaration, bylaws,
or rules and regulations any person or class of persons adversely affected by the failure to
comply has a claim for appropriate relief. <u>Subject to the requirements of section 515B.3-102</u>,
the association shall have standing to pursue claims on behalf of the unit owners of two or
more units.

19.10 (b) The court may award reasonable attorney's fees and costs of litigation to the prevailing

19.11 party. Punitive damages may be awarded for a willful failure to comply. <u>This subsection</u>

19.12 does not apply to litigation or arbitration involving construction defect claims.
