1.7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.8	Section 1. [5.60] DEMOCRACY CUP.
1.9	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section, the definitions have the
1.10	meanings given.
1.11	(b) "Postsecondary institution" means public postsecondary institutions and nonprofit
1.12	degree-granting institutions physically located in Minnesota and registered with the Office
1.13	of Higher Education under section 136A.63.
1.14	(c) "Report" means a National Study for Learning, Voting, and Engagement report issued
1.15	by the Institute for Democracy and Higher Education at Tufts University.
1.16	Subd. 2. Enrollment; reports. All postsecondary institutions must enroll in the National
1.17	Study for Learning, Voting, and Engagement by the Institute for Democracy and Higher
1.18	Education at Tufts University. Within 30 days of receiving a report, a postsecondary
1.19	institution must send the report to the secretary of state. The secretary of state must make
1.20	the reports publicly available on the secretary of state's website.

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(d) An updated residential housing list must be certified to the county auditor no earlier
than 20 days prior to each election. The certification must be dated and signed by the chief
officer or designee of the postsecondary educational institution and must state that the list
is current and accurate and includes only the names of persons residing as of the date of the
certification.
(e) The county auditor shall instruct the election judges of the precinct in procedures for
use of the list in conjunction with photo identification. The auditor shall supply a list to the
election judges with the election supplies for the precinct.
(f) The county auditor shall notify all postsecondary educational institutions in the county
of the provisions of this subdivision.
Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 201.1611, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
Subdivision 1. Forms. (a) All postsecondary institutions that enroll students accepting
state or federal financial aid shall must provide voter registration forms to each student as
early as possible in the fall quarter during the fall and spring of each year. In state election
years, it must be provided 15 days in advance of the deadline for registering to vote for the
state general election. If the voter registration forms are provided electronically, the electronic
message must be devoted exclusively to voter registration.
(b) All school districts shall must make available voter registration applications each
May and September to all students registered as students of the school district who will be

eligible to vote at the next election after those months. A school district has no obligation
to provide voter registration applications to students who participate in a postsecondary
education option program or who otherwise reside in the district but do not attend a school
operated by the district. A school district fulfills its obligation to a student under this section
if it provides a voter registration application to the student one time.

3.25 (c) The voter registration forms must contain spaces for the information required in 3.26 section 201.071, subdivision 1, and applicable rules of the secretary of state. The institutions 3.27 and school districts may request these forms from the secretary of state. Institutions shall 3.28 <u>must</u> consult with their campus student government in determining the most effective means 3.29 of distributing the forms and in seeking to facilitate election day registration of students 3.30 under section 201.061, subdivision 3. School districts must advise students that completion 3.31 of the voter registration application is not a school district requirement.

3.32 (d) The institutions and school districts must report to the secretary of state by November
 3.33 <u>30 of each year on their implementation of this section. At a minimum, the report must</u>

4.4	(e) By February 1 of each year, the secretary of state must report to the chairs and ranking

4.6	received from institutions and school districts. The secretary must highlight best practices
4.7	and innovative methods that were most effective in registering students to vote.

4.10	Subd. 3. Voter information. (a) All postsecondary institutions that enroll students
4.11	accepting state or federal financial aid must maintain a webpage to share resources to help
4.12	students determine where and how they are eligible to vote. The webpage must include the
4.13	following:
4.14	(1) resources from state and local election officials on voter registration and voting
4.15	requirements including voter registration deadlines; residency requirements; acceptable
4.16	methods of proving residency for same day registration, as applicable; and absentee voting
4.17	options;
4.18	(2) applicable deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot, as well as
4.19	additional options for early and in-person voting, and voting on election day;
4.20	(3) resources to help students who are registered in another state to apply for absentee
4.21	ballots in that state, and may include resources from state and local election officials from
4.22	that state;
4.23	(4) the campus vote coordinator's name and contact information; and
4.24	(5) the voter engagement plan required by paragraph (b), clause (3).
4.25	(b) All postsecondary institutions that enroll students accepting state or federal financial
4.26	aid must designate a staff person as the campus vote coordinator. The campus vote
4.27	coordinator must:
4.28	(1) ensure the institution complies with this section;
4.29	(2) report the number of physical and electronic voter registrations collected on an annual
4.30	basis on the institution's voting website; and

- 5.2 <u>identifies goals and activities, resources to accomplish the identified goals and activities,</u>
- 5.3 and individual or key departments responsible for executing the identified goals and activities.
