1.7	Section 1. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSED.
1.8	An amendment to the Minnesota Constitution is proposed to the people. If the
1.9	amendment is adopted, article VII, section 1, will read:
1.10	Section 1. (a) Every person 18 years of age or more who has been a citizen of the United
1.11	States for three months and who has resided in the precinct for 30 days next preceding
1.12	an election; who, at the time of voting in person, shall present government-issued
1.13	photographic identification as prescribed by law, or who, when not voting in person, shall
1.14	provide government-issued proof of identity as prescribed by law; and whose eligibility to
1.15	vote has been established under this section shall be entitled to vote in that precinct. The
1.16	state must make photographic identification available to eligible individuals at no charge.
1.17	The place of voting by one otherwise qualified who has changed his residence within 30
1.18	days preceding the election shall be prescribed by law. The following persons shall not be
1.19	entitled or permitted to vote at any election in this state: A person not meeting the above
1.20	requirements; a person who has been convicted of treason or felony, unless restored to civil

2.14	eligibility verification before a ballot is cast or accepted; and that the state provide at no
2.15	charge an approved photographic identification to eligible individuals?
