1.1 A bill for an act

1.2 relating to public safety; creating a supplemental nonprofit security grant program;

1.3 appropriating money.

1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. **SUPPLEMENTAL NONPROFIT SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM.**

1.6 Subdivision 1. Establishment; appropriation. \$..... in fiscal year 2018 and \$..... in

1.7 fiscal year 2019 are appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of public safety

1.8 for a grant program administered by the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency

1.9 Management.

1.10 Subd. 2. Eligibility and application. Nonprofit organizations whose applications for

1.11 funding through the Federal Emergency Management Agency's nonprofit security grant

1.12 program have been approved by the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency

1.13 Management are eligible for grants under this section. No additional application shall be

1.14 required for grants under this section, and an application for a grant from the federal program

1.15 is also an application for funding from the state supplemental program.

1.16 Subd. 3. Amount, preference, and timing of grants. Organizations meeting the

1.17 eligibility requirements of subdivision 2 may receive grants of up to \$75,000, except that

1.18 the total received by any individual from both the federal nonprofit security grant program

1.19 and the state supplemental nonprofit security grant program shall not exceed \$75,000. Grants

1.20 shall be awarded in an order consistent with the ranking given to applicants for the federal

1.21 nonprofit security grant program. No grants under the state supplemental nonprofit security

1.22 grant program shall be awarded until the announcement of the recipients and the amount

1.23 of the grants awarded under the federal nonprofit security grant program.

- 2.1 Subd. 4. **Administrative costs.** The commissioner may use up to one percent, on an
2.2 annual basis, of the appropriation received under this section to pay costs incurred by the
2.3 department in administering the supplemental nonprofit security grant program.
