BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 121A.224, is amended to read:

## 121A.224 OPIATE ANTAGONISTS.

- Subdivision 1. School district or charter school. (a) A school district or charter school must maintain a supply of opiate antagonists, as defined in section 604A.04, subdivision 1, at each school site to be administered in compliance with section 151.37, subdivision 12.
- (b) Each school building must have at least two doses of a nasal opiate antagonist 1.10 available on site. 1.11
- (c) The commissioner of health shall identify resources, including at least one training 1.12 video, to help schools implement an opiate antagonist emergency response and make the 1 13 resources available for schools. 1.14
- (d) A school board may adopt a model plan for use, storage, and administration of opiate 1.15 1.16 antagonists.
- Subd. 2. High school students. A school district or charter school must allow a student 1.17 1.18 in grades 9 through 12 to possess and administer an opiate antagonist to another high school student if the district or charter school has received written authorization from the student's 1.19 parent or guardian permitting the student to possess and administer the opiate antagonist. 1.20 The protections of section 604A.04 apply to the possession and administration of opiate

antagonists according to this section. 1.22
