A bill for an act
relating to natural resources; requiring Minnesota Zoological Garden to provide free admission on certain holidays; establishing fees; amending Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 85A.02, subdivision 17.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 85A.02, subdivision 17, is amended to read:
Subd. 17. Additional powers. (a) The board may establish a schedule of Charges for
admission to or for the use of the Minnesota Zoological Garden or any related facility-
Notwithstanding section 16A.1283, legislative approval is not required for the board to
establish a schedule of charges for admission or use of the Minnesota Zoological Garden
or related facilities. The board shall have a policy admitting elementary school children at
a reduced charge when they are part of an organized school activity is:
(1) \$12 for each visitor age six to 12;
(2) \$18 for each visitor age 13 to 65; and
(3) \$12 for each visitor age 66 and older.
(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), the Minnesota Zoological Garden will must offer
free admission:
(1) throughout the year to economically disadvantaged Minnesota citizens equal to ten
percent of the average annual attendance;
(2) to any child under six years of age;
