1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. METRO MOBILITY ENHANCEMENT TASK FORCE.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Task force established. A Metro Mobility Enhancement Task Force is
1.7	established to examine options to enhance Metro Mobility program service under Minnesota
1.8	Statutes, section 473.386. The goal of the task force is to partner with transportation network
1.9	companies, as defined in section 65B.472, subdivision 1, paragraph (e), to increase program
1.10	service levels and efficiency.
1.11	Subd. 2. Membership. (a) The task force consists of the following members:
1.12	(1) one representative from Metro Mobility, appointed by the Metropolitan Council;
1.13	(2) one elected official from each metropolitan county, as defined in Minnesota Statutes,
1.14	section 473.121, subdivision 4, each of whom must be from a district or unit of government
1.15	that is located within the Metro Mobility service area, appointed by the respective county
1.16	board in consultation with cities in that county;
1.17	(3) at least one and no more than three individuals representing transportation network
1.18	companies, as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 65B.472, subdivision 1, appointed as

3.5	(d) Members of the task force serve without compensation or payment of expenses.
3.6	(e) The task force may accept gifts and grants, which are accepted on behalf of the state
3.7	and constitute donations to the Metropolitan Council. Funds received under this paragraph
3.8	are appropriated to the Metropolitan Council for purposes of the task force.
3.9	Subd. 5. Legislative report. (a) By February 15, 2018, the task force must submit a
3.10	report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with
3.11	jurisdiction over transportation policy and finance.
3.12	(b) At a minimum the report must:
3.13	(1) summarize the work of the task force and its findings;
3.14	(2) describe the current Metro Mobility program;
3.15	(3) identify at least three potential service level approaches that involve partnering with
3.16	and incorporating transportation network companies; and
3.17	(4) provide any recommendations for program and legislative changes.
3.18	Subd. 6. Expiration. The task force under this section expires February 15, 2018, or
3.19	upon submission of the report required under subdivision 5, whichever is earlier.
3.20	EFFECTIVE DATE ; APPLICATION . This section is effective the day following
3.21	final enactment and applies in the counties of Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey,
3.22	Scott, and Washington.

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
