1.1 A bill for an act

1.2 relating to education finance; increasing alternative teacher compensation aid;

1.3 eliminating the program waiting list; eliminating the program aid proration;

1.4 appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 122A.415,

1.5 subdivisions 4, 5.

1.6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.7 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 122A.415, subdivision 4, is amended to read:

1.8 Subd. 4. **Basic alternative teacher compensation aid.** (a) The basic alternative teacher

1.9 compensation aid for a school with a plan approved under section 122A.414, subdivision

1.10 2b, equals ~~65~~ 75 percent of the alternative teacher compensation revenue under subdivision

1.11 1. The basic alternative teacher compensation aid for a charter school with a plan approved

1.12 under section 122A.414, subdivisions 2a and 2b, equals ~~\$260~~ \$285 times the number of

1.13 pupils enrolled in the school on October 1 of the previous year, or on October 1 of the

1.14 current year for a charter school in the first year of operation, times the ratio of the sum of

1.15 the alternative teacher compensation aid and alternative teacher compensation levy for all

1.16 participating school districts to the maximum alternative teacher compensation revenue for

1.17 those districts under subdivision 1.

1.18 (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) and subdivision 1, the state total basic alternative

1.19 teacher compensation aid entitlement must not exceed ~~\$75,840,000 for fiscal year 2016 and~~

1.20 \$88,118,000 for fiscal year 2017 and 2018, \$89,078,000 for fiscal year 2019,

1.21 \$88,900,000 for fiscal year 2020, and \$115,000,000 for fiscal year 2021 and later. The

1.22 commissioner must limit the amount of alternative teacher compensation aid approved under

1.23 this section so as not to exceed these limits by not approving new participants or by prorating

1.24 the aid among participating districts, intermediate school districts, school sites, and charter

2.1 schools. The commissioner may also reallocate a portion of the allowable aid for the biennium  
2.2 from the second year to the first year to meet the needs of approved participants.

2.3 (c) Basic alternative teacher compensation aid for an intermediate district or other  
2.4 cooperative unit equals \$3,000 times the number of licensed teachers employed by the  
2.5 intermediate district or cooperative unit on October 1 of the previous school year.

2.6 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective for revenue for fiscal year 2021 and later.

2.7 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 122A.415, subdivision 5, is amended to read:

2.8 Subd. 5. **Alternative teacher compensation levy.** The alternative teacher compensation  
2.9 levy for a district receiving basic alternative teacher compensation aid equals the product  
2.10 of (1) the difference between the district's alternative teacher compensation revenue and  
2.11 the district's basic alternative teacher compensation aid, times (2) the lesser of one or the  
2.12 ratio of the district's adjusted net tax capacity per adjusted pupil unit to ~~\$6,100~~ \$7,000.

2.13 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective for revenue for fiscal year 2021 and later.

2.14 Sec. 3. **APPROPRIATION; ALTERNATIVE TEACHER COMPENSATION.**

2.15 Subdivision 1. **Department of Education.** The sums indicated in this section are  
2.16 appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Education in the fiscal year  
2.17 designated.

2.18 Subd. 2. **Alternative teacher compensation program.** For alternative teacher  
2.19 compensation aid under Minnesota Statutes, section 122A.415:
