Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 326B.435, subdivision 2, is amended to read: 1.5 Subd. 2. Powers; duties; administrative support. (a) The board shall have the power 1.6 to: 1.7 (1) elect its chair, vice-chair, and secretary; 1.8 (2) adopt bylaws that specify the duties of its officers, the meeting dates of the board, 1.9 and containing such other provisions as may be useful and necessary for the efficient conduct 1.10 of the business of the board; 1.11 (3) adopt the Plumbing Code that must be followed in this state and any Plumbing Code 1.12 amendments thereto. The board shall adopt these rules pursuant to chapter 14 and as provided in subdivision 6, paragraphs (e) and (f);

- (7) refer complaints or other communications to the commissioner, whether oral or written, as provided in subdivision 8, that allege or imply a violation of a statute, rule, or order that the commissioner has the authority to enforce pertaining to code compliance, licensure, or an offering to perform or performance of unlicensed plumbing services;
