1.8	Section 1. [43A.3165] PROCUREMENT OF A PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGER
1.9	AND A PLATFORM TECHNOLOGY VENDOR.
1.10	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms have
1.11	the meanings given.
1.12	(b) "Market check" means a technology-driven evaluation of prescription drug pricing
1.13	based on benchmarks derived from reverse auction processes conducted in the United States
1.14	over the immediately preceding 12 months.
1.15	(c) "Pharmacy benefit management services" means:
1.16	(1) the procurement of prescription drugs at a negotiated rate for dispensation within
1.17	the State Employees Group Insurance Program (SEGIP) to enrollees;
1.18	(2) the administration and management of the prescription drug benefit under SEGIP;

3.2	and any recommendations offered by the Formulary Committee under section 256B.0625,
3.3	subdivision 13c, the commissioner shall specify the terms of a participant bidding agreement
3.4	that all bidders must accept as a prerequisite for participation in the reverse auction process,
3.5	including:
3.6	(1) common definitions;
3.7	(2) prescription drug classifications;
3.8	(3) retail pricing rules, including maximum allowable cost price lists and dispensing
3.9	fees; and
3.10	(4) any other contract terms the commissioner deems necessary to further the purpose
3.11	of this section as specified under subdivision 2.
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3.12	(d) A pharmacy benefit manager that submits a bid under this subdivision must provide
3.13	the commissioner access to complete pharmacy claims data necessary for the commissioner
3.14	to conduct the reverse auction and to carry out administrative and management duties.
3.15	(e) The terms of any contract entered into under this subdivision shall not be modified
3.16	by the pharmacy benefit manager except with the approval of the commissioner.
3.17	(f) The commissioner may structure the contract awarded under this subdivision to pay
3.18	the cost of the technology platform and the associated professional services contracted for
3.19	under this subdivision by assessing a per-prescription fee to be paid directly by the pharmacy
3.20	benefit manager to the technology platform vendor.
3.21	(g) The commissioner may perform annual market checks on pharmacy benefit manager
3.22	services performed by the pharmacy benefit manager during the term of the contract. A
3.23	market check performed under this paragraph may include an evaluation of the effect of
3.24	alternative drug pricing metrics, such as the national average drug acquisition cost and
3.25	average wholesale price, on the cost of prescription drugs and savings to the state.
3.26	(h) The commissioner shall make regular, periodic payment of invoices within the time
3.27	periods specified in the contract based on the automated adjudication of invoiced claims
3.28	using the technology platform to validate that claims payments comply with the terms of
3.29	the contract.
3.30	Subd. 4. Technology platform vendor. (a) At least three months before the reverse
3.31	auction process is scheduled to be completed, the commissioner shall procure through a
3.32	competitive bidding process a contract with a professional services vendor for a technology
