1.7	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section, the following terms
1.8	have the meanings given them.
1.9	(b) "Automatic external defibrillator" or "AED" means an electronic device designed
1.10	and manufactured to operate automatically or semiautomatically for the purpose of
1.11	delivering an electrical current to the heart of a person in sudden cardiac arrest.
1.12	(c) "AED registry" means a registry of AEDs that requires a maintenance program
1.13	or package, and includes, but is not limited to: the Minnesota AED Registry, the National
1.14	AED Registry, iRescU, or a manufacturer-specific program.
1.15	(d) "Public Access AED" means an AED that is intended, by its markings or display,
1.16	to be used or accessed by the public for the benefit of the general public that may be in the
1.17	vicinity or location of that AED. It does not include an AED that is owned or used by a
1.18	hospital, clinic, business, or organization that is intended to be used by staff and is not
1.19	marked or displayed in a manner to encourage public access.
1.20	(e) "Maintenance program or package" means a program that will alert the AED
1.21	owner when the AED has electrodes and batteries due to expire or replaces those expiring
1.22	electrodes and batteries for the AED owner.

(f) "Public safety agency" means local law enforcement, county sheriff, municipal

police, tribal agencies, state law enforcement, fire departments, including municipal
