1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. [325E.3893] COSMETIC FRAGRANCE INGREDIENTS.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Definition. For purposes of this section, "cosmetic" means:
1.7	(1) articles intended to be rubbed, poured, sprinkled, or sprayed on, introduced into, or
1.8	otherwise applied to the human body or any part of the human body for cleansing,
1.9	beautifying, promoting attractiveness, or altering the appearance; and
1.10	(2) articles intended for use as a component of any articles in clause (1), except that the
1.11	term does not include soap.
1.12	Subd. 2. Disclosure. (a) A manufacturer of a cosmetic manufactured, distributed, or
1.13	offered for retail sale in Minnesota shall disclose on the manufacturer's Web site the full
1.14	list of ingredients in the product, including the component ingredients of fragrances, flavors,
1.15	and color additives. The Chemical Abstract Service (CAS) number or International
1.16	Nomenclature of Cosmetic Ingredients (INCI) name of each ingredient must be included
1.17	on the ingredient list provided on the manufacturer's Web site.
1.18	(b) The ingredients must be listed in descending order of predominance, except that an
1.19	ingredient present at a concentration of not more than one percent may be listed without
1.20	respect to order of predominance.
1.21	(c) The manufacturer is not required to list the concentration of an ingredient in the
1.22	product on the manufacturer's Web site.
