1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. [136A.1265] TEACHER CANDIDATES OF COLOR SCHOLARSHIPS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Establishment. A scholarship program for teacher candidates of color
1.8	is established to provide scholarships to qualified candidates with financial needs.
1.9	Subd. 2. Eligibility. A person may apply for a scholarship if the person:
1.10	(1) has been admitted to a teacher preparation program approved by the Board of
1.11	Teaching;
1.12	(2) self-identifies to the teacher preparation program as a member of populations
1.13	underrepresented among the licensed teachers in the state relative to the diversity of students
1.14	as measured under section 120B.35, subdivision 3, paragraph (b), clause (2);
1.15	(3) is meeting satisfactory academic progress as defined under section 136A.101,
1.16	subdivision 10;
1.17	(4) is a resident student as defined in section 136A.101, subdivision 8; and
1.18	(5) has a gross family income of \$125,000 or less.
1.19	Subd. 3. Amount. (a) The maximum scholarship amount is \$10,000 per year for full-time
1.20	study distributed up to \$5,000 per academic term. The commissioner of higher education
1.21	must establish a sliding scale of scholarship amounts based on the amount of available

2.5	for part-time study.

2.8	Subd. 4. Distribution. Scholarships must be paid to the teacher preparation institution

2.16	adjusted gross family income of \$125,000 or less enrolled in a Board of Teaching-approved
2.17	teacher preparation program and who:
2.18	(1) are interested in teaching in a high needs subject area or region after graduating and
2.19	receiving their teaching license; or
2.20	(2) identify as belonging to an underrepresented racial or ethnic group.
2.21	Subd. 1a. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section, "high needs subject area or region"
2.22	means a shortage of teachers teaching in particular subject areas or a shortage of teachers
2.23	teaching in particular regions of the state identified in the commissioner of education's

3.5	(2) demonstrate financial need based on criteria established by the commissioner under
