1.9	REQUIREMENT.
1.10	Subdivision 1. Licensure requirement. A school district or charter school must employ
1.11	a qualified teacher, as defined in section 122A.16, to provide instruction in a preschool,
1.12	school readiness, school readiness plus, prekindergarten, or other school district or charter
1.13	school-based early education program.
1.14	Subd. 2. Exemptions. A person employed by a school district or charter school as a
1.15	teacher in an early education program during the 2022-2023 school year who does not have
1.16	a Minnesota teaching license is exempt from the licensure requirement under subdivision
1.17	1 until July 1, 2027, or until the teacher is able to obtain a Minnesota teaching license,
1.18	whichever occurs first. Notwithstanding this exemption from the licensure requirement,
1.19	these individuals are teachers under section 179A.03, subdivision 18.
