1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 136A.246, subdivision 4, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 4. Application. Applications must be made to the commissioner on a form provided
1.8	by the commissioner. The commissioner must, to the extent possible, make the application
1.9	form as short and simple to complete as is reasonably possible. The commissioner shall
1.10	establish a schedule for applications and grants that must provide for two application and
1.11	grant cycles per fiscal year. The application must include, without limitation:
1.12	(1) the projected number of employee trainees;
1.13	(2) the competency standard for which training will be provided;
1.14	(3) the credential the employee will receive upon completion of training;
1.15	(4) the name and address of the eligible training provider;
1.16	(5) the period of the training; and
1.17	(6) the cost of the training charged by the eligible training provider. The cost of training
1.18	includes tuition, fees, and required books and materials.
1.19	An application may be made for training of employees of multiple employers either by
1.20	the employers or by an organization on their behalf.
