1.4BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5Section 1. Laws 2008, chapter 179, section 7, subdivision 27, is amended to read:

1.6Subd. 27. **State Trail Acquisition,**

1.7**Rehabilitation, and Development**15,320,000

1.8To acquire land for and to construct and

1.9renovate state trails under Minnesota

1.10Statutes, section 85.015.

1.11\$970,000 is for the Chester Woods Trail from

1.12Rochester to Dover.

1.13\$700,000 is for the Casey Jones Trail.

1.14\$750,000 is for the Gateway Trail, to replace

1.15an at-grade crossing of the Gateway Trail

1.16at Highway 120 with a grade-separated

1.17crossing.

1.18\$1,600,000 is for the Gitchi-Gami Trail

1.19between Silver Bay and Tettegouche State

1.20Park.

1.21\$1,500,000 is for the Great River Ridge Trail

1.22from Plainview to Elgin to Eyota.

- 2.1 \$1,500,000 is for the Heartland Trail.
- 2.2 \$500,000 is for the Mill Towns Trail from
- 2.3 Lake Byllesby Park to Cannon Falls.
- 2.4 \$150,000 is for the Mill Towns Trail within
- 2.5 the city of Faribault.
- 2.6 \$1,500,000 is for the Minnesota River Trail
- 2.7 from Appleton to Milan.
- 2.8 \$2,000,000 is for the Paul Bunyan Trail from
- 2.9 Walker to Guthrie.
- 2.10 \$250,000 is for the Root River Trail from
- 2.11 Preston to Forestville State Park.
- 2.12 \$100,000 is for the Root River Trail, the
- 2.13 eastern extension.
- 2.14 \$250,000 is for the Root River Trail, the
- 2.15 eastern extension Wagon Wheel.
- 2.16 \$550,000 is to connect the Stagecoach Trail
- 2.17 with the Douglas Trail in Olmsted County.
- 2.18 Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes,
- 2.19 section 16A.642, the bond authorization
- 2.20 and appropriation of bond proceeds for this
- 2.21 project are available until June 30, 2014.
- 2.22 \$3,000,000 is to rehabilitate state trails.
- 2.23 For any project listed in this subdivision that
- 2.24 the commissioner determines is not ready to
- 2.25 proceed, the commissioner may allocate that
- 2.26 project's money to another state trail project
- 2.27 in this subdivision. The chairs of the house
- 2.28 and senate committees with jurisdiction
- 2.29 over environment and natural resources
- 2.30 and legislators from the affected legislative
- 2.31 districts must be notified of any changes.
