1.9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.10	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 35.155, subdivision 10, is amended to read:
1.11	Subd. 10. Mandatory registration. (a) A person may not possess live Cervidae in
1.12	Minnesota unless the person is registered with the Board of Animal Health and meets all
1.13	the requirements for farmed Cervidae under this section. Cervidae possessed in violation
1.14	of this subdivision may be seized and destroyed by the commissioner of natural resources.
1.15	(b) A person whose registration is revoked by the board is ineligible for future registration
1.16	under this section unless the board determines that the person has undertaken measures that
1.17	make future escapes extremely unlikely.
1.18	(c) The board must not allow new registrations under this section for possessing

1.19 white-tailed deer.

- Subd. 11. Mandatory surveillance for chronic wasting disease; depopulation. (a)
 An inventory for each farmed Cervidae herd must be verified by an accredited veterinarian
 and filed with the Board of Animal Health every 12 months.
- (b) Movement of farmed Cervidae from any premises to another location must be reported
 to the Board of Animal Health within 14 days of the movement on forms approved by the
 Board of Animal Health. A person must not move farmed white-tailed deer from any premises
- 2.9 to another location unless the movement is directly to a location for slaughter.
- 2.10 (c) All animals from farmed Cervidae herds that are over 12 months of age that die or2.11 are slaughtered must be tested for chronic wasting disease.
- 2.12 (d) The owner of a premises where chronic wasting disease is detected must:
- 2.13 (1) depopulate the premises of Cervidae after the federal indemnification process has2.14 been completed or, if an indemnification application is not submitted, within a reasonable
- 2.15 time determined by the board in consultation with the commissioner of natural resources;
- 2.16 (2) maintain the fencing required under subdivision 4 on the premises for five years after

Subd. 12. Importation. A person must not import white-tailed deer into the state from 2.20 a farmed Cervidae herd. A person must not import other Cervidae into the state from a herd 2.21 that is infected or exposed to chronic wasting disease or from a known chronic wasting 2.22 disease endemic area, as determined by the board. A person may import Cervidae other 2.23 than white-tailed deer into the state only from a herd that is not in a known chronic wasting 2.24 disease endemic area, as determined by the board, and the herd has been subject to a state 2.25 or provincial approved chronic wasting disease monitoring program for at least three years. 2.26 Cervidae imported in violation of this section may be seized and destroyed by the 2.27 commissioner of natural resources. 2.28

3.3	(a) \$ in fiscal year 2022 is appropriated from the general fund to the Board of Animal								
3.4	Health to offer a herd buyout payment to the owner of each white-tailed deer herd registered								
3.5	under Minnesota Statutes, section 35.155. The board must pay \$ per animal, including								
3.6	fawns, with each animal disposed of as determined by the board. By October 1 of each fiscal								
3.7	year, an owner must accept or decline the buyout offered by the board under this section.								
3.8	A participating owner must sign a contract with the board certifying that the owner will not								
3.9	have or allow any wild or farmed white-tailed deer to be located on the premises for at least
